#### Inter- School Chess Tournament

Our school hosted a chess tournament on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> July, with pupils from Larkrise and Windmill joining two teams of St Joseph's pupils. St Joseph's A (U11) team triumphed at the event with St Joseph's B (U9) a close second. We are very proud of the tenacity, skill, strategy and sportsmanship shown by our pupils. They were supportive of each other, gracious in victory and learnt from each of their matches.

#### **ChessFest London!**

On Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> July, Ms Tweedie took 7 pupils from Y3 and Y4, to the London ChessFest. It was an excellent day – they got to play against the Under 8 World Champion (who played all 7 of them simultaneously and won!), meet a Grandmaster and play other schools. Thank you to the CSC (chess in schools and communities) who gave a grant for the transport and to the Office and Dr Varney for helping to arrange for this. Well done to our amazing pupils – they were a credit to the school.

#### **Chesskids Holiday Tournaments**

Andrew Varney will be running on-line chess tournaments over the summer for our Chesskid pupils. Typically, they will take place on the days that chess clubs would have been running and are open to anyone from St Joseph's who has a Chesskid account and is in the official St Joseph's group. The first tournament is set up for Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> July 4pm-5pm. More information is available when your child logs in to their account.

#### Year 6 IMPS trips - Injury Minimization Programme!

On Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> July, Year 6 visited the John Radcliffe Hospital to take part in IMPS. IMPS is the Injury Minimization Programme for Schools which was developed by a team from the John Radcliffe Hospital led by Professor Willett. The children learned basic resuscitation, what to do if someone is choking or unconscious and how to prevent accidents happening in the first place. We are so lucky to have this resource available and hope that our pupils feel more confident should they ever need to apply the skills they have learned.

#### School Swimming - Post COVID Catch-up

We have good news! This year, we have invested in two afternoons of swimming per week, as many children missed out on learning to swim during the pandemic (due to long periods of pool closures and the suspension of lessons both in and out of school). In Years 3, 4 & 5, all children have been swimming at some point this year. In Year 6, those pupils not able to confidently swim 25m also swam for half a term. We feel we have made a difference in terms of numbers of children being able to swim 25m and show basic water safety skills, we had record success levels when Year 5s were tested on Friday!

- 18 out of the 29 Year 5 children have now achieved the required level.
- Almost 50% of Year 4 children have already completed the required level.
- 7 out of the 24 Year 6 children achieved the required level after 6 weeks of lessons.

Those pupils who have not officially passed the standard yet, have also significantly improved in a sporting activity which can provide exercise and fun as well as save a life! Well done to all St Joseph's swimmers this year and a huge thank you to the school staff who have accompanied them.


