## First Holy Communion and Confirmation

On the 2<sup>nd</sup> October, we emailed families with children in Year 3 and/or Year 6 with leaflets about preparation for the Sacraments of Holy Communion and Confirmation. ## **Attendance and Punctuality**

There are many of you who bring your children to school on time every day and as a result they have excellent attendance. Attendance and punctuality are important disciplines that help to structure our daily lives and must be taught to the children. Schools have a duty to prepare pupils for life in the 21<sup>st</sup> century as fully formed citizens and part of this journey is to teach them about the importance of these two disciplines.

#### The Government line on attendance is very clear:

Central to raising standards in education and ensuring all pupils can fulfil their potential is an assumption so widely understood that it is insufficiently stated — pupils need to attend school regularly to benefit from their education. Missing out on lessons leaves children vulnerable to falling behind. Children with poor attendance tend to achieve less in both primary and secondary school.

Every pupil must have an attendance of 96% in order for them to comply with the government regulation. When a child's absence falls below this figure it has a dramatic impact on their learning. The figures below state very clearly the affect absence has on your child's learning.

If your child misses	That Equals	Which is	Over 13 years of schooling that is
10 minutes a Day	50 minutes a Week	1.5 Weeks per Year	Nearly <u>1/2 Year</u> of lost learning
20 minutes a Day	1 hour 40 minutes a Week	2.5 Weeks per year	Nearly <u>1 Year</u> of lost learning
30 minutes a day	1/2 a Day a Week	4 Weeks per year	Nearly 1.5 Years of lost learning
1 hour a Day	1 day a Week	8 Weeks per year	Nearly <u>2.5 Years</u> of lost learning



## Practical Help and Signposting

Sadly, things at the moment are difficult for many of our families. Bills all seem to be rising, and everything is getting more expensive.
